


Figure 7: Existing Water System

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-05

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, CASS COUNTY, NEBRASKA, TO VACATE A DEDICATED STREET, SAID DEDICATED STREET TO BE VACATED DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS: THAT PART OF SECOND STREET NORTH OF D STREET AND EAST AND SOUTH OF TAX LOT 10, ABUTTING BLOCKS 16 AND LOT 16 OUTLOTS, ORIGINAL TOWN LOCATED IN THE NORTH HALF OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 20, TOWNSHIP 10 NORTH, RANGE 9 EAST OF THE SIXTH P.M., EAGLE, CASS COUNTY NEBRASKA, MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED HEREIN; TO PROVIDE THAT THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, CLERK AND THE APPROPRIATE DEPARTMENT, WHETHER ONE OR MORE. OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, SHALL BE AUTHORIZED TO IMPLEMENT THIS ORDINANCE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE SEVERABILITY OF ANY SECTION, CLAUSE, PROVISION OR PORTION HEREOF FOUND UNCONSTITUTIONAL OR INVALID; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; TO PROVIDE THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE PUBLISHED WITHIN THE FIRST FIFTEEN DAYS AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND APPROVAL IN PAMPHLET FORM IN THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, AND SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND TAKE EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND APPROVAL, AS PROVIDED BY LAW AND AS PROVIDED HEREIN; AND TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE SHALL NOT BECOME A PART OF THE EAGLE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA.

WHEREAS, it has been determined by Board of Trustees of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, that it is expedient for the public good or in the best interest of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, that the hereinafter described dedicated street be vacated, to wit:

All of that part of Second Street abutting Block 16, Original Town and Outlots Lot 16, north of D Street and South of Tax Lot 10, located in the North Half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 20, Township 10 North, Range 9 East of the Sixth P.M., Eagle, Cass County, Nebraska, as shown on Exhibit A attached hereto.

WHEREAS, the street has not been utilized as a street, if ever, and the amount of special damages that the abutting property owners are entitled to receive, is deemed to be none, and;

WHEREAS, the Village maintains utilities within the Right of Way and the Village will retain a Utility Easement, 30-foot in width (15 feet on either side of the sewer line currently located therein) and Village reserves the right of ingress and egress over, across, and under the Easement area for the purpose of surveying, constructing, reconstructing, locating, relocating, altering, inspecting, repairing, replacing, adding to, maintaining and operating at anytime, utilities including but not limited to electrical, water, sewer, gas, or telecommunications equipment, with appurtenances and accessories thereto, and for its successors, assigns, and its franchisees and their respective successors and assigns. Such ingress and egress shall be exercised in a reasonable manner. Said reservation shall also provide that at no time will any buildings, structures, fences, landscaping,

trees or shrubs be placed, permitted or maintained by the property owner which shall impede the uses for which this reservation is made nor shall other property be erected, constructed, used or placed on or below the surface of the Easement nor will any soil be removed from the surface of the Easement that would infringe upon the integrity of the purpose of the utilities, with appurtenances and accessories thereto, located therein. In the event a structure or obstruction impedes in the easement area, the Village shall not be responsible for any damages incurred by the property owner as a result of the reservation set forth above.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, as follows:

Section 1. That the findings hereinabove made should be and are hereby made a part of this Ordinance as fully as if set out at length herein.

Section 2. That the following dedicated street shall be vacated, to wit:

All of that part of Second Street abutting Block 16, Original Town and Outlots Lot 16, north of D Street and South and East of Tax Lot 10, located in the North Half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 20, Township 10 North, Range 9 East of the Sixth P.M., Eagle, Cass County, Nebraska.

As shown on the Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Section 3. That the aforenoted vacated street shall revert to the owners of the property abutting said vacated street, to wit:

East Half –the West 88' of fractional Lot 16 in the NE¼ of the SE¼ of Section 20, Township 10 North, Range 9 East of the 6th P.M., Cass County, Nebraska;


West Half- E 85'Lot 1 and ½ Vacated Street in Block 16 Original Town, Eagle, Cass County, Nebraska:

West Half –OUTLOTS W TR TL10 N1/2 SE1/4 Section 20, Township 10 North, Range 9 East of the 6th P.M., Cass County, Nebraska.

- Section 4. That the Clerk of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, be instructed to file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Cass County Register of Deeds within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this Ordinance.
- Section 5. That the Board of Trustees of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, its Clerk, and any other department, whether one or more, of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, are hereby authorized and directed to implement this Ordinance.
- Section 6. That should any section, paragraph, sentence or word of this Ordinance hereby adopted be declared for any reason to be invalid, it is the intent of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, that it would have passed all other portions of this Ordinance independent of the elimination herefrom of any such portion as may be declared invalid.

- Section 7. That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances passed and approved prior to the passage, approval, and publication of this Ordinance, in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.
- Section 8. That this Ordinance shall be published within the first fifteen (15) days after its passage and approval in pamphlet form, and shall be effective the 15th day from and after it is passage, approval, and publication as provided herein.
- Section 9. That it is the intention of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this Ordinance shall not become a part of the Eagle Municipal Code of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska.

Open Forum – Terry Caddy encouraged the Village Board to be attentive to the farmer's cooperative property adjacent to the pool; if this property is listed for sale, it would be worth considering, as it would create an extension to the current park ground. Caddy said the former Casey's General Store located at 310 Highway 34 is in the process of being rehabilitated and may be worth considering as a public meeting space. Marcus Hochstein discussed the suspected residential use of the commercial building at 509 S. 4th Street.

Motion by Todd, second by Hochstein, to accept the resignation of Robin Sinner from the Eagle Planning Commission. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

The players would provide their own portable nets and supplies. The option of utilizing the concrete slab on the west side of the park was discussed as an alternate location. Agenda item tabled until the June 20, 2023 board meeting.

Motion by Dobbins, second by Caylor, to approve a Culvert Agreement between Jeremiah Lippold and the Village of Eagle at 625 South 2^{nd} Street. Voting: Ayes -5. Motion carried.

Discuss/possible action: Consider options for the purchase of a check-stop valve for the Eagle Pool showers – Three proposals were received for a replacement check-stop valve for the Eagle Pool from Grainger and Cornhusker Winnelson. The check-stop valve is necessary to adequately mix hot and cold water for the showers and sinks at the pool. Hochstein and Meier offered to inspect the existing check-stop valve and make a recommendation to the Village Board at the next meeting as to which new product to purchase. Agenda item tabled until the June 20, 2023 board meeting.

Discuss/possible action: Consideration of regular full-time Maintenance Employees working four days per week at ten hours per day (4/10 work schedule) – The Human Resources Committee met with the Maintenance Supervisor to discuss the 4/10 work schedule proposal last week. After a brief discussion, the Village Board generally agreed to leave the work schedule as is. No action taken.

Report from Attorney – Freeman-Caddy said an ordinance to vacate a portion of 2nd Street north of D Street will likely be on the next meeting's agenda. The Municipal Code section and rules pertaining to culvert agreements should be reviewed and amended where necessary in the coming weeks. Shipping containers in residential zoning districts

was briefly discussed and will be discussed at more length by the Planning Commission. Meier discussed unlicensed and inoperable vehicles. Nystrom said the office will schedule a second quarter inspection for vehicles in non-compliance. Unregistered offroad vehicles were briefly discussed; the Sheriff's Department will be reminded again to strictly enforce the ordinance and cite violators.

Report from Clerk/Treasurer – Nystrom said there have been a total of 121 dogs and 21 cats licensed year-to-date. There have been 19 off-road vehicles licensed to date. Coordination with the Village Engineer is underway to begin advertising procedures for sanitary sewer main lining. Keep Cass County Beautiful will be hosting a three-in-one recycling event in Eagle on June 10, 2023. Nystrom said the Metropolitan Area Planning Agency (MAPA) provided aerial drone footage of Eagle and the surrounding area. The water tower will be drained tomorrow for interior cleaning and maintenance. Nystrom said the total monthly income ending May 31, 2023 was \$291,890.24.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:58 p.m.
