




#### **ARTICLE 1—OWNER AND BIDDER**

- 1.02 The undersigned Bidder proposes and agrees, if this Bid is accepted, to enter into an Agreement with Owner in the form included in the Bidding Documents to perform all Work as specified or indicated in the Bidding Documents for the prices and within the times indicated in this Bid and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Bidding Documents.

#### ARTICLE 6—BIDDER'S REPRESENTATIONS AND CERTIFICATIONS

#### 6.01 Bidder's Representations

- A. In submitting this Bid, Bidder represents the following:
  - 1. Bidder has examined and carefully studied the Bidding Documents, including Addenda.
  - Bidder has visited the Site, conducted a thorough visual examination of the Site and adjacent areas, and become familiar with the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
  - 3. Bidder is familiar with all Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work, including all American Iron and Steel requirements.
  - 4. Bidder has carefully studied the reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or adjacent to the Site and the drawings of physical conditions relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, with respect to the Technical Data in such reports and drawings.
  - Bidder has carefully studied the reports and drawings relating to Hazardous Environmental Conditions, if any, at or adjacent to the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings.
  - 6. Bidder has considered the information known to Bidder itself; information commonly known to contractors doing business in the locality of the Site; information and observations obtained from visits to the Site; the Bidding Documents; and the Technical Data identified in the Supplementary Conditions or by definition, with respect to the effect of such information, observations, and Technical Data on (a) the cost, progress, and performance of the Work; (b) the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction to be employed by Bidder, if selected as Contractor; and (c) Bidder's (Contractor's) safety precautions and programs.
  - 7. Based on the information and observations referred to in the preceding paragraph, Bidder agrees that no further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Times, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract.

- 8. Bidder is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by Owner and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Bidding Documents.
- Bidder has given Engineer written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that Bidder has discovered in the Bidding Documents, and of discrepancies between Site conditions and the Contract Documents, and the written resolution thereof by Engineer is acceptable to Contractor.
- 10. The Bidding Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for performance and furnishing of the Work.
- 11. The submission of this Bid constitutes an incontrovertible representation by Bidder that without exception the Bid and all prices in the Bid are premised upon performing and furnishing the Work required by the Bidding Documents.

#### 6.02 Bidder's Certifications

- 3. Bidder has not solicited or induced any individual or entity to refrain from bidding.
- 4. Bidder has not engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, or coercive practices in competing for the Contract. For the purposes of this Paragraph 8.02.A:
  - a. Corrupt practice means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value likely to influence the action of a public official in the bidding process.
  - b. Fraudulent practice means an intentional misrepresentation of facts made (a) to influence the bidding process to the detriment of Owner, (b) to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels, or (c) to deprive Owner of the benefits of free and open competition.
  - c. Collusive practice means a scheme or arrangement between two or more Bidders, with or without the knowledge of Owner, a purpose of which is to establish bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels.

RE: CIPP Procedures and Exclusions

- 1. Cleaning procedures will take place with a sewer vacuum/jet truck combination unit. Multiple cleaning passes will take place prior to installation of CIPP Liner. End seals then will be placed at the pipe penetrations and the CIPP liner will be installed. After the liner has been cured, we will robotically reinstate all live service connections associated with this line.
- 2. Bypass pumping for these lines is anticipated to be minimal since there are low levels of flow that go through this area. We will monitor the flow in the upstream manhole and use the sewer vacuum truck (if needed) to pump the sewage flow.
- 3. All affected business/residences will be notified via door knockers and personal contact of the work prior to beginning the lining process to communicate the installation procedures and the effect of the blocked service connection during installation.
- 4. A final CCTV inspection will then take place after all services have been reinstated and given to the Utility personnel for further distribution.

#### **Exclusions:**

- 1. Manhole #61 on the provided map is a cleanout. This cleanout may have to be dug up and exposed to be able to line this pipe. We exclude all labor/equipment/seeding required to complete this work.
- 2. There is a bend in the pipe from MH 39 to MH 37. We propose grinding the pipe down with a robotic cutter to lessen the degree of bend at the pipe joint and then lining through it. This will likely cause a wrinkle in the liner when cured. The structural integrity of the liner will not be affected. We will complete this work as noted only if we receive approval by Village officials.

Dobbins said the Street Committee was informed that the local sand volleyball league would like to barricade a small section of F Street on the next two Tuesday nights to provide portable lighting during their tournaments. The Street Committee approved the request as it would not impact traffic in the area. Hochstein said Eagle Vision would like to have an outdoor movie event at the lot east of the pool on August 19, 2023. Terry Caddy said the first citation for operating an unregistered off-road vehicle on the public street was issued last week.

Motion by Meier, second by Hochstein, to approve minutes as typed for the previous meeting. Voting: Ayes – Dobbins, Meier, Hochstein. Caylor abstained. Motion carried.

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Report from Fire & Rescue – Caylor estimated 5 rescue calls and 1 fire call since the June 20, 2023 board meeting. Past and future training events were discussed. Meier said a pallet of water was donated to the department by Anheuser-Busch. The department pool party will be held on July 22, 2023. Meier said the old fire truck sitting outside the Municipal Office will be going to auction.

Open Forum – Nystrom asked the Village Board to begin looking at their schedules for a Budget Workshop meeting to be held sometime towards the end of August; please submit any capital outlay requests to the office by August 1, 2023. Dobbins said the Street Committee was informed that the local sand volleyball league would like to barricade a small section of F Street on the next two Tuesday nights to provide portable lighting during their tournaments. The Street Committee approved the request as it would not impact traffic in the area. Hochstein said Eagle Vision would like to have an outdoor movie event at the lot east of the pool on August 19, 2023. Terry Caddy said the first citation for operating an unregistered off-road vehicle on the public street was issued last week.

Report on Streets and Maintenance – Caddy said approximately 15 loads of brush were chipped after the severe wind storm earlier this month. Crosswalks, parking stalls and curbs will be painted beginning the first week of August. The chlorine pump at the pool failed last week and a spare unit was installed. The operating hours on the primary lawn mower (John Deere X300) was discussed and whether there was any interest in entertaining a trade-in proposal.

Report on Wells and Sewer – Caddy said fire hydrant flushing is on the schedule to be completed. The Hartland Estates lift station is awaiting final plumbing for natural gas at which time a meter will be installed. Nystrom said the Invitation for Bids was published in the Voice News for the 2023 CIPP Sewer Lining Project. Bid openings will be held on July 27, 2023 at 11:00 a.m. Caddy said overall water usage has decreased in July. The WWTP has been treating between 85,000-100,000 gallons of

wastewater per day. Nystrom said the water leak in the alley adjacent to  $5^{\rm th}/6^{\rm th}$  & E Street was repaired.

Motion by Meier, second by Hochstein, to approve minutes as typed for the previous meeting. Voting: Ayes – Dobbins, Meier, Hochstein. Caylor abstained. Motion carried.

Report from Committees and Boards – The Eagle Health Board will be looking to schedule a meeting in late July/early August. Course options for Frisbee Golf will be discussed at the August 1, 2023 board meeting. The coolant leak on the fire station generator was discussed. The South Meadows generator was repaired after the transfer switch failed during the last storm. Meier discussed recent concerns with some of the language being used at the pool by patrons; the lifeguards were reminded that swearing is prohibited and patrons can be asked to leave if it continues.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:46 p.m.
